So, How Many TTE Programs Do Exist In The U.S.?

As CTTE president, one of the most common questions I get asked is “. . . how many technology teacher education programs are there?”. That is often difficult to answer. For instance, one university in the northeast U.S. is in the process of closing down their current TTE program. So, while they (a) do have a program they (b) aren't currently accepting new majors. Do they count?

Other schools have a tract that leads to initial licensure in technology education, but it's extremely difficult to identify faculty that are professionally involved with ITEA, CTTE, etc. Still others may have a program that hasn't be used for years. And about “emergency credentials” run through some unit of a College of Education?

Report To The ITEA Board Of Directors

Several times a year, each affiliate Council of ITEA, through it's Board representative, submits a report about the activities of the association. This was the bulleted list of items that appeared in the mid-October report (submitted to ITEA officials).

Note: Past-president Michael De Miranda is the current CTTE representative on the ITEA Board.

Activities since Spring 2008 and the ITEA conference in Salt Lake City include . . .

- * The Council's program of events for Louisville, handled under the leadership of Vice President Chris Merrill, has been developed and approved, and most recently been promoted via ITEA and CTTE websites.
- * The 2008 CTTE yearbook on ENGINEERING IN TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION, #57 in the series, was mailed to members over the summer.
- * Work is well on the way regarding the 2009 Council yearbook, which will include selected chapters from previous publications . . . all works that align with the 10 ITEA / CTTE standards for teacher preparation programs. This publication should draw attention to our assessment system, and the need to cover key concepts in each program. The book has 14 readings by 17 well-known authors (DeVore, Sanders, Wright, etc.), organized into 10 chapters.
- * CTTE president Richard Seymour was a participant in the ITEA Strategic Planning Workshop at the Seven Springs Resort (PA) over the summer.
- * A monthly newsletter, called ONE FIVE, goes out to the entire membership. Issues were forwarded through the CTTE listserv on the 15th of each month all spring and summer.
- * The executive team has been in contact, via phone and the Internet, on many matters.
- * The NCATE accreditation team is in the process of handling 6 program (SPA) reviews during Fall 2008, three "new" reviews and three follow-ups from the last review period.
- * The Council's website has been continuously updated over the summer and into the start of the fall term. URL: www.ctteonline.org
- * There will be no Council elections this coming winter / spring, as the current officer team is serving the first or second years of a 3-year commitment. Note: There will be, however, a naming of a CTTE Technology-Educator-Of-The-Year at the annual ITEA Conference in Louisville in March 2009 . . . that ballot will be sent out in another month or so.
- * CTTE committees continue to complete routine tasks (many with November targets on their agendas).
